In Memory Of Charles H Murtomaki March 22, 1938 – May 9, 2022





The CSOTFA Board of Directors is sad to report the passing of Chuck Murtomaki. Chuck had been an active member of District 7 since the 80's and had served the association in several capacities over the years. He had served as President multiple occasions and as a member of the Board of Directors as their District Representative on several occasions.

He was a great fiddler and guitar player and loved singing. He loved to sing Country Western tunes and knew "a million of'em". Because of an familiar inherited condition he had to give up the fiddle. But he was a great guitar player.

Chuck was born and raised on a dairy farm in upper Michigan. His family were dairy farmers from Finland. Chuck worked the dairy farm doing all the things that are required to operate a farm.

Chuck was a Navy guy (and a very handsome one I might add) and retired from the Navy after 23 years of service. He was a WO-2 Chief Warrant Officer 2 Specialty Sonarman. Warrant officers serve as technical specialists with command authority within their field of expertise.

It will be in 2023 though!

As you are probably aware the last Contest that we held fell to the awful wiles of.... COVID......Vendors canceled, audience didn't show, some volunteers figured they had better stay home. We did have contestants though. However, obviously we ended up in the red.

We (D-10 Board) have had discussions of what we were going to do. Drop it or go ahead with a different format. The different format won out. It looks like we will move forward with a combination of a different type of Fiddle Contest, and exhibits from the same era of early day farm implements and household wares, and even a Model T flash tour.

The different type of Fiddle contest which will be held is a Fiddlin' Bee. It is a spin-off of the Fiddle-Off that Tim Rued brought to us after noticing it at a Minnesota Fiddle Contest. That's not to say though that it will ever be a replacement for a good ol' time Fiddle Contest; but it is becoming a growing trend in Midwestern States. Some of you have been to Tim's Fiddle-Off. He introduced it to us in 2016 at the National Heirloom Expo in Santa Rosa and continued it every year until COVID hit. It will happen again in 2023 where Tim will continue with his format of the Fiddle-Off.

The main difference between District 10's Fiddlin' Bee and Tim's Fiddle-Off will be the selection of tunes that will be on the list to be studied from. This list will be comprised of tunes from every District within CSOTFA. We will reach out to you and ask for some of the most played tunes from your area. I found that even within our District 10 area that there are favorite tunes that vary from county to county! Once we gather the tunes from y'all it will be compiled into a "List of Tunes" and put on our District 10's website. Ponder this....just think how many more tunes one can learn from this list; and if one so chooses to test this newly acquired repertoire they can become a contestant at our FIDDLIN' BEE! (and there will be prizes!!!!).

This can be fun for anyone who wishes to put in the time to learn the tunes....it is not a parlor game....it will be a 'Contest' of your knowledge of these tunes, one must be able to play the melody and hold the rhythm. See photos below.

The "early day" exhibits will be from a local Branch of Early Day Gas Engine & Tractor Association (which I also belong to) and private collections. This Association exhibits at different Fairs and Events all over California. (See photos) And so....2023 here we come!!


