## **Presidents Message**

Dear Friends,

I wanted to give you an overview of some things that have been happening in our world and to give you a heads up about the upcoming State Fiddle Contest in April.

To keep a VERY long story reasonably short, Tex has been facing some pretty serious health issues beginning on November 22. These resulted in more than a few ambulance rides to the local ER; admission to St. Elizabeth's Hospital here in Red Bluff; transfer to Oak River Rehab in Anderson for four weeks; a side trip to Mercy Hospital in Redding in the middle of rehab; discharge on December 29; more ambulance rides and ER visits starting last Saturday and finally admittance to St. Elizabeth's on Sunday.

The original diagnosis was MSSA-staph blood infection which was treated with four weeks of IV antibiotics. At the beginning, he was so weak he couldn't sit up, stand, feed himself, roll over, or much of anything else. When they discharged him and up until last Saturday, he was walking around the house normally, using a wheeled walker outside and getting stronger every day.

Then last Saturday, just when we thought all was well, he developed an intense (and very painful) UTI along with a recurrence of the blood infection. The good news is that thanks to the wonderful medical care he has received, he is well on the road to recovery and should be discharged to home on Monday (Jan. 22)

So.....what does this have to do with the State Fiddle Contest? I just wanted you all to know that you need to make plans and preparations to do all of the preliminary work as well as the actual running of the fiddle contest that Tex and I have been handling for quite awhile.

At this point, I believe we will be able to attend the contest, but I don't think you should count on Tex doing very much, if any, MC work and I don't know whether I will be able to run Registration.

We are more than willing to share information ahead of time with whoever wants to know more about what needs to be done to run the contest, but someone else will have to step up and do the work. We are relying on our District Directors to carry on the work.

I wanted to get this information out to you as soon as I had a pretty solid grasp on what was happening. Basically, Tex & I can advise, inform, offer some suggestions, but cannot really plan, schedule, organize, or do the work the contest requires.

It is also possible that Tex will continue his recovery to the point that I won't be doing so much fretting and caretaking and may get my brain back to the point where I can do some of what I usually do.

I just don't have any way of predicting and my crystal ball is long gone. I know Tex and I are neither one of us indispensable, and that you guys certainly have the talent and expertise to pull off a great contest.

Walker Creek Music Camp—New Leadership, Same Great Camp!

We're delighted to have this camp back on its feet, and want to share the news that it is now under new leadership.
